

Since 2006, the Frankfurter Buchmesse has been inviting German publishers to exhibit a selection of their books abroad in order to meet this great demand.

This spring, 14 renowned publishers and imprints will be part of the Children's Books on Tour collection. A total of 44 compelling titles will travel with the German Collective Stands to the following fairs: Bologna, London, Prague (Guest of Honour Germany), Brussels, Abu Dhabi, Warsaw, Turin, Beijing, Guadalajara, Jakarta and Taipei.

These titles will also be displayed and promoted throughout the year at the Frankfurter Buchmesse Book Information Centre in Beijing, at the book fairs in Sarajevo and Seoul and during the Frankfurt Invitation Programme.

An entertaining adventure with just the right mix of horror and humour – suitable even for children who still find reading challenging.

When sorting and classifying items, children group them according to certain characteristics or attributes (e.g., colour, shape, size) and find similarities and differences between objects.

The learning cards *Sorting and Classifying* help children to develop a range of thinking skills and build the foundations for later problem-solving.


